## The Family Partnership Model

The Family Partnership Model aligns the different aspects of schools' work with parents and families under 5 Key Themes, with an overarching theme of monitoring and evaluation cutting across all areas:

Theme 1: Fostering effective family-school partnerships

Theme 2: Communicating & consulting effectively

Theme 3: Enabling parental engagement in learning

Theme 4: Empowering parents and carers to develop their own skills

Theme 5: Supporting successful transitions

The process will support schools to review their provision from the view point of senior leaders, teaching staff, support staff, governors and parents.
