### What is the Family Information Service?

Section 12 of the Childcare Act 2006 (the information duty) places a statutory duty on all local authorities in England to deliver information, advice and assistance to parents of children up to the age of 20 years and up to 25 years for young people with a disability or additional need.

The London Borough of Ealing delivers this through the provision of the Family Information Service (FIS).



#### **Family Information Service**

At Ealing's Family Information Service, we make sure that children, young people and families living in the borough, get the information, advice and guidance they need on all the local services and different types of support available to them.

- ✓ Registered childcare e.g. nurseries, childminders, etc.
- ✓ Help available with the cost of childcare including Tax Credits, early years funding for two, three and four-year-old
- ✓ Support organisations and services
- ✓ Registered Food Bank Referrer
- ✓ Access services and support for families living with addition needs and/or disabilities
- ✓ Local activities for children and young people

#### The FIS also:

- ✓ Offer a brokerage service

### Two Year Old Funding

Help paying for childcare: Free education and childcare for 2-year-olds - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

FREE childcare places of up to <u>15 hours per week</u> over 38 weeks of the year for children aged 2 whose families are on a low income. Starts from the term after child's 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday.

#### **Benefits:**

- ✓ Build early socialisation skills
- ✓ Develop speaking and listening skills
- ✓ Have fun learning new things
- Improve confidence and get school ready

Research shows children who go to high-quality early education and childcare providers make good progress with their language, physical and social development.

When the time comes for them to go to school they are better prepared and this advantage stays with them right through school and into adulthood

### **Two Year Old Funding**

Help paying for childcare: Free education and childcare for 2-year-olds - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

#### **Eligibility criteria:**

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit, and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax, not including benefit payments
- Child tax credits, and your household income is £16,190 a year or less

#### 2-year-olds can also get free childcare if they:

- are looked after by a local authority
- have an education, health and care (EHC) plan
- get <u>Disability Living Allowance</u>
- have left care under an adoption order, special guardianship order or a child arrangements order

### **Two Year Old Funding**

#### A non-EEA citizen who cannot claim benefits

Your 2-year-old may get free childcare if you are getting support under the Immigration and Asylum Act and have either:


- claimed asylum in the UK and are waiting for a decision (known as 'part 6')
- been refused asylum in the UK (known as 'section 4')
- A 2-year-old you care for may also get free childcare if your household income is £15,400
  a year or less after tax, and you have any of the following:
  - leave to remain with 'no recourse to public funds' on family or private life grounds
  - support from your local council because you have 'a child in need', for example they
    have a disability or a child protection plan
  - the right to live in the UK because you're the main carer of a British citizen (known as a <u>'</u>Zambrano Carer')
  - Afghan resettlement programme

### Three and Four Year Old Funding

Help paying for childcare: 15 hours free childcare for 3 and 4-year-olds - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

#### **Eligibility criteria:**

- All children are eligible regardless of income or residency status
- For all families in England
- For children who are 3- and 4-year-olds
- Starts the term after the child's 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday

### **Three and Four Year Old 30 Hours**

30 hours free childcare - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk)

Enabling more parents to access employment with participating childcare providers

**Extension of 3 &4 year olds offer-** 30 hours free (includes the 15 hours) childcare over 38 weeks of the year (approved childcare provider on register) if criteria is met.

#### Eligibility criteria

- ✓ Live in England
- ✓Income per person less than £100,000
- ✓ must each expect to earn (on average) at least £142 per week (equal to 16 hours at the National Minimum or Living Wage)
- ✓ are on maternity, paternity or adoption leave, or you're unable to work because you are disabled or have caring responsibilities, you could still be eligible.

### Holiday Activities & Food (HAF) Programme

Free holiday provision available to children and young people (Reception- Yr11) eligible for benefits-related free school meals and some limited places for vulnerable children and young people. Funding has been confirmed until the end of 2024.

**Spring**, **Summer and Winter school holidays** at least 4 hours a day, 4 days a week for 6 weeks a year.

What we're trying to achieve through this programme is for children who attend provision:

- a) To eat more healthily over the school holidays;
- b) To be more active during the school holidays;
- To take part in engaging and enriching activities which support the development of resilience, character and well being along with their wider education attainment;
- d) To be safe and not to be socially isolated;
- e) To have greater knowledge of health nutrition; and
- f) To be more engaged with school and other local services.

### **Holiday Activities & Food (HAF) Programme**

#### Children and families who do not meet standard eligibility criteria

Local authorities have discretion to use up to 15% of their funding to provide free or subsidised holiday club places for children who are not in receipt of benefits-related free school meals but who the local authority believe could benefit from HAF provision. This may include, for example:

- children assessed by the local authority as being in need, at risk or vulnerable
- young carers
- looked-after children or previously looked after children
- children with an EHC plan (education, health and care)
- children who have low attendance rates at school or who are at risk of exclusion
- children living in areas of high deprivation or from low-income households who are not in receipt of free school meals
- children in transition phases between nursery and primary school or primary and secondary school

These places will be allocated via a referral system for professionals.

### Early Help Assessment & Plan (EHAP)


The Early Help Assessment and Plan (EHAP) is the process and tool Ealing uses for professionals to supporting children and young people and their families, through the delivery of multi-agency, multi-disciplinary or targeted support.

This is done as early as possible to tackle an emerging problem or issue before it becomes bigger, harder to address and affects the development or life chances of the child or children in the family

The EHAP is only used when a multiagency, multi-disciplinary or targeted approach is necessary.

EHAP used for Step Down from Social Care.

### **Additional Needs & Disability**

#### **Local Offer**

- Local Offer website is a <u>statutory requirement</u> all boroughs have their own unique offer
- Local Offer is a useful resource for parents, young people and professionals
  - o services and support if concerned about child's development
  - o early intervention support and advice whilst awaiting diagnosis
  - Local family support services
  - Referral pathways for therapeutic services e.g., Speech & Language Therapy, Child Development Team
  - Education, Health & Care Plan process, timescales
  - o Inclusive activities and things to do
  - o Money & Benefits e.g., discounts, grants
  - Information for young people (Preparing for Adulthood), includes: careers advice and guidance, managing finances, travel assistance





- Parent Portal- goes live after October Half Term. Digitalisation of the ERSA process- improving transparency and communication of information sharing among parents and professionals. Any parent going through EHCP process can opt to be part of the Portal.
