Prevent Incident of Concern Flowchart for School Settings:



Report to Police

Follow the school's child protection procedures, informing the school designated safeguarding lead

You/staff is concerned that a child is at risk of radicalisation?

NOTICE

CHECK

- Ensure checks are carried out with staff and school records
- Record concerns
- Speak to the student and peers, if appropriate
- Inform the Designated Safeguarding Lead

SHARE

Do you still feel that the child is at risk of radicalisation?

YES

Before sharing information, you should try to get consent from the parents or carers (if under 18). Do not do this if it would place the child or young person at more risk of harm

Make a referral to:

If other safeguarding harms are identified (in addition to radicalisation harms), follow your schools existing safeguarding procedures (ECIRS)

- Consider discussing concerns with parent
- Explain concerns and enquire into family circumstances and vulnerabilities that might exist in the wider family

NO

- Assess whether risk can be resolved within school
- Consider support from your Safer Schools Officer
- RECORD ANALYSE ASSESS and continue cycle

If the risk/issue cannot be resolved in-house: consider making an Early Help referral through ECIRS



- Explain to parents/carers that we will need to follow appropriate actions such as contact ECIRS
- Be highly sympathetic and reassuring
- Use collaborative approach: 'How can we help you?'
